- Vital statistics;
- Dress, Grooming, Hygiene

Components of AVPU - ☐- Alert;

- responds to Verbal stimuli;
- responds to Painful stimuli;
- Unresponsive

Secondary Assessment: OPQRST-I - ☐especially for Respiratory and Cardiac patients:

- Onset;
- Provocation/Palliation;
- Quality;
- Radiation;
- Scale/Severity;
- Time;
- Interventions

What is OPQRST? - ☐a mnemonic for remembering the questions to ask when assessing the patient's chief complaint or major symptoms

Onset - ☐- When and how did the symptom begin?
