Source D

After I had read out the concentrated edition to my two guests, Moltke remarked: "Now it has a different ring, it sounded before like a parley [a negotiation]; now it is like a flourish in answer to a challenge." I went on to explain: "If in execution of his Majesty's order I at once communicate this text, which contains no alteration in or addition to the telegram, not only to the newspapers, but also by telegraph to all our embassies, it will be known in Paris before midnight, and... will have effect of a red rag upon the Gallic [French] bull. Fight we must if we do not want to act the part of the vanquished without a battle. Success, however, essentially depends upon the impression which the organization of the war makes upon us and others; it is important that we should be the party attacked..."
