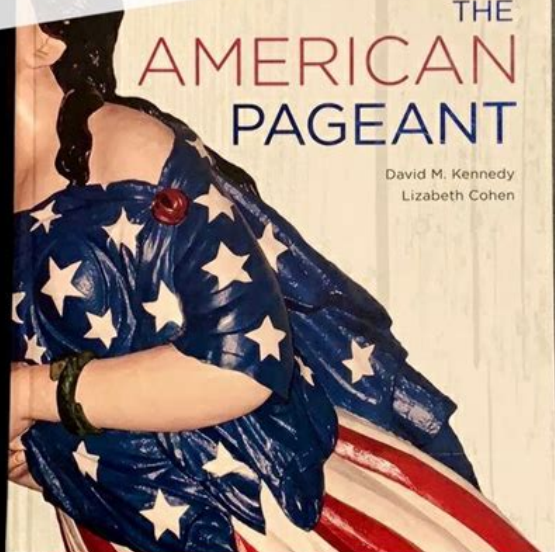

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## Chapter 30

# The War to End War

1917–1918

The world must be made safe for democracy. Its peace must be planted upon the tested foundations of political liberty. We have no selfish ends to achieve. Our deepest wish is to secure the peace of the world. We desire no conquest, no dominion. We seek no indemnities for our sacrifices and bloodshed. We desire no material compensation for the sacrifices we shall freely make.

WOODROW WILSON, WAR MESSAGE, APRIL 2, 1917

*Dusting death cruelly with Woodrow Wilson. The lover of peace, as fate would have it, as forced to lead a hesitant and peace-loving nation to war. As the last days of 1916 slipped through the fingers, the president made one final, futile attempt to avert the inevitable. On January 22, 1917, he delivered one of his most moving addresses, restating America's commitment to neutrality and declaring that only a negotiated "peace without victory" would prove durable. Germany's warlords responded with a blow of the fist. On January 31, 1917, they announced to an astonished world their decision to wage unrestricted submarine warfare, sinking all ships, including America's, in the war zone.*

*Was this rash act? War with America was the last thing Germany wanted. But after three ghastly years of trench warfare, Germany's leaders decided the distinction between combatants and noncombatants was a meaningless one. They could no longer afford to play the peace card. Thus they jerked the United States into the war. Wilson, his idealistic diplomatic relations with Germany*

*launched a filibuster to block the measure, Wilson denounced them as a "little group of willful men" who were rendering a great nation "helpless and contemptible." But their obstruction was a powerful reminder of the continuing strength of American isolationism.*

*Meanwhile, the sensational Zimmermann note was intercepted and published on March 1, 1917, infuriating Americans, especially westerners. German foreign secretary Arthur Zimmermann had secretly proposed a German-Mexican alliance, tempting anti-Yankee Mexico with veiled promises of recovering Texas, New Mexico, and Arizona.*

*On the heels of this provocation came the dreaded "overt" acts in the Atlantic, where German U-boats sank four unarmed American merchant ships in the first two weeks of March. As one Philadelphia newspaper observed, "The difference between war and peace is that now we are at war." Simultaneously came the revolution in Russia had toppled the czar. America could now fight foursquare for democracy on the side of the Allies, without the black shadow of Russian despotism in the Allied fold.*
