1. **Assessment:** collection of data about a patient's health state, the nurse looks at all data collected and the patient's records from databases
 - **Subjective data:** what the patient says about themselves
 - **Objective data:** what the nurse observes by inspecting, percussing, auscultating, and palpating
2. **Diagnostic Reasoning:** analyzing health data, drawing conclusions to identify diagnosis
3. **Setting Priorities:**
 - **First level priority:** think Airway, Breathing, Circulation, things that are immediately life threatening
 - **Second level priority:** require prompt intervention, think things like pain, mental status change, and altered lab values
 - **Third level priority:** problems that can be addressed later, think about health promotion and psychological issues
4. **What are barriers to Evidence-Based Practice?**
 - Lacking research skills, lack of time, lack of confidence to implement change, and lack of support
5. **Types Of Databases:**
 - **Complete:** includes a complete health history and full physical exam (**often done in a primary care setting or on admission to the hospital**)
 - **Focused/problem centered:** limited or short term problem, you would collect a mini database that is smaller in scope, (**EX: coming in to the hospital with shortness of breath 2 days after surgery**)
 - **Follow-up:** used in all settings to follow up on previously identified problems (**EX: getting stitches removed, BP medication follow up**)
 - **Emergency:** urgent/rapid collection of data collection of critical info during an emergency situation
6. **Hand Hygiene:** single most important element of infection control (CDC)
7. **Bias:** preconceived idea of someone/something
 - Must be left at the door when taking care of patients
 - The nurse must assess their own biases/beliefs before caring for patients who are different than them
 - Your beliefs cannot interfere with your care, always be mindful of your need to adapt as a nurse
8. **The Language:** Health takes on a different meaning for different people
 - **Health:** means the balance of a person inside & outside
 - **Illness:** loss of balance inside/outside
 - **Health determinants:** factors that influence health such as personal, social, economic, and environmental
