

Army Transgender Training Ppt 2022



Army Directive 2016-35 (dated 7 October 2016)



This directive establishes policies and procedures for gender transition in the Army. Gender transition in the Army begins when a Soldier receives a diagnosis from a military medical provider (or a civilian medical provider if the Soldier is ineligible for military medical care) indicating that gender transition is medically necessary. Gender transition ends when the Soldier's gender marker in DEERS is changed to show the Soldier's preferred gender.
