Alien and Sedition Acts - correct answer Created because of the aftermath of the French Revolution, the XYZ Affair, and during the Quasi War with the French.

Naturalization Act: Increased the time required to become a U.S. citizen from 5 to 14 years.

Alien Enemies Act: Allowed U.S. government to arrest and deport all aliens who are citizens of countries that are at war with the U.S.

Sedition Act: made it a crime to speak or write critically about the President, Congress, Federal government, or federal laws. It's purpose was to silence criticism.
