Primary prevention - answer✓✓Health promotion (nutrition and sex education), specific protection (use of seat belts, avoidance of allergens, and immunizations); targets well populations or those already ill; does not exist for scoliosis

Mammogram - answer✓✓Every 2 years for women 50 to 74

Secondary prevention - answer✓✓Early detection, diagnosis, and treatment I; mammography, colonoscopy

Tertiary prevention - answer✓✓Recovery, rehabilitation, and specific measures to minimize disability and increase functioning (breast reconstruction)
