A finy clipping from a newspaper, mailed without comment from a secret band of terrorists in Zagreb was the torch that lit the world aftre with the war in 1914. The tiny clipping claimed that Archduke Francis Ferdinand would visit Sarajevo, the capital of Bosnia, on June 28 to direct army maneuvers in the neighboring mountains. When Francis Ferdinand and his retinue drove from the station they were allowed to pass the first two conspirators. Francis Ferdinand was to leave the city as a rebellion was starting. He with his wife, Archduchess Sofia were to take the shortest way out of the city and to go quickly. As they were driving, two bullets were shot, one that hit his wife in the abdomen. The second bullet struck the Archduke close to his heart and he died almost instantly.

In 1908 Terpitz was allowed to build more ships over a shorter period, thus threatening to outbuild the royal navy.
