The Central Idea

A. ☐ The central idea of a story may also be known as the main idea or the theme. It often is the "message," the "moral," or the "life-lesson" of a story, poem, or article.

B. ☐ The central idea is a universal idea that may apply to you and to all people; it is not specific to just the characters in the story. **Do not confuse the central idea with the plot of a story,** otherwise known as the sequence of events in a story.

C. ☐ The central idea is not just a one-word topic like love or power or bullying. It has to be a full sentence, like "Although love is often pleasant, it also involves a lot of pain" or "Power can be dangerous in the wrong hands." If your central idea is too short, it may help to include some sort of consequence, such as, "If a person is too greedy for material wealth, they risk losing the things that bring spiritual wealth."

D. ☐ The author does not reveal or state the central idea explicitly; it is hinted at or implied throughout the story, and that is why you must read closely and thoughtfully in order to make connections.

E. ☐ You can think of the central idea as the main message about life that the author wants the reader to learn, but the author teaches this lesson through characters, conflict, plot, figurative language, setting, imagery tone, mood, flashback, irony, foreshadowing, dialogue, symbols, allegory, point of view, allusion, repetition, etc.
