The Thirteen Colonies


The 13 Original Colonies were a group of British colonies along the coast of the Atlantic Ocean in North America. The first colony was **Virginia**, founded in the year 1607. This was followed by **New Hampshire** (1623), **New York** (1626), **Massachusetts** (1630), **Maryland** (1633), **Connecticut**, **Rhode Island** (1636), **Delaware** (1638), **North Carolina** and **South Carolina** (1663 – this was originally the Province of Carolina which split into North and South Carolina in 1712), **New Jersey** (1664), **Pennsylvania** (1681), and **Georgia** (1731).

In 1776, the 13 colonies declared independence and formed the **United States of America**.
