TB: It's said that after Lucas was finished for the day, you'd put on your leather jacket and go out partying. Is that transition tough?

CH: By day, on Lucas, in between takes or when it was wrap, I'd just go into my dressing room, take my make-up off, spike my hair, put on my clothes and bandana and become Corey. I'd go crazy... do everything. Silver Bullet, that's a good example. I had to cry and yell a lot. Then the director would say 'Cut,' and I'd just say, 'Oh, Dad, is it lunch yet?' I just threw it back and became Corey.

TB: After finishing a movie, is it difficult to get back into the school routine?

CH: Yeah, I hate it. One minute I'm working, and the next thing, I'm in school thinking I should be working. When I'm working, I wish it would never end, but it ends and I hate it.

TB: What's your home in Toronto like?

CH: I have a dog, a blue chow chow. Her name is Muffin. Her real name is Lil' Blueberry Muffin. It's the only blue chow chow I've ever heard of... I have a best friend his name is Jason Mandel. He and I get along 'cause he's very mature, and I think I'm very mature. And when I show him an interview or something, he goes, "Way to go, kid." He's my best, best friend, and I mention him in everything.

TB: What does your room look like?

CH: I used to have bunk beds, but now I sleep on my mattresses piled up. It's so comfortable. My dog sleeps with me.

TB: What would be your ideal next project?

CH: Sly Stallone's son in Rambo III. Just me and him. I'd like to do a gun picture. Rambo is my favorite film ever.

TB: Do you have any message for your fans?

CH: Yeah, Sly Stallone (laughing). No, I hope they enjoy my films and thank them. ★
