16. What do solid white lines indicate?  
They mark traffic lanes going in the same direction. (pg 17)

They represent a solid barrier and may not be crossed, not even for a left turn or to enter a driveway. (pg 17)

18. What do broken white lines mean?  
They separate traffic lanes on roads with two or more lanes in the same direction. (pg 17)

19. What is the correct way to make a lane change?  
Signal, look in all your mirrors, glance over your shoulder to make sure the lane is clear. (pg 18)

20. When can you make a left turn at a red light?  
When turning from one one-way street onto another one-way street. (pg 21)

21. What is the "three-second rule"?  
Allow three-seconds between the time the vehicle ahead of you passes a given point and the time your vehicle reaches the same point to avoid traveling too close. (pg 24)

Don't look directly into oncoming headlights; look to the right to avoid looking directly into the headlights of oncoming traffic. (pg 27)

When it first starts to rain or snow because oil and dust have not washed away. (pg 28)

Hold the arm straight out and the forearm and hand straight up, palm facing forward. (pg 33)

32. What is the hand signal to indicate stopping or slowing down?  
Point the arm and hand down, palm facing the back. (pg 33)

33. What should you always keep in mind when sharing the road with large vehicles?  
They have bigger blind spots than cars, take longer to stop, need more room to maneuver and it takes cars longer to pass them. (pg 34)

34. What must you do when approached by an emergency vehicle (from any direction) using a siren or flashing lights?  
Yield the right-of-way and immediately drive to the right-hand edge or curb of the roadway clear of any intersection until the emergency vehicle has passed. (pg 36)

35. What are the "rules" for driving through construction areas or "cone zones"?  
Slow down, allow extra following room, merge early, be prepared to stop and do not use your cell phone. (pg 41)

36. When parking facing downward on a hill, what should you do with the wheel of your vehicle?  
Turn the front wheel into the curb or toward the side of the road. (pg 42)

37. What should you do to make sure your car won't roll into traffic when parking facing uphill?  
Turn the front wheels away from the curb, let the vehicle roll back so that the wheel is gently touching the curb and set the parking brake. (pg 42)

38. What does a WHITE painted curb mean?  
Stop only long enough to pick up or drop off passengers or packages. (pg 43)

39. What does a GREEN painted curb mean?  
Park for a limited time. (pg 43)

40. What does a RED painted curb indicate?  
No stopping, standing or parking. (pg 43)
