6. Create sentence stems or frames to aid students talking about the image. Then have students practice with a partner.	Sentence stems and frames support students with a language structure for discussion using the academic vocabulary.
7. Have the class build their own paragraph using the labeled image, sentence stems or frames and partner talk.	Students can use all the scaffolds to produce this quick write embedding the academic vocabulary. Some will copy the sentence stems or frames used in Step 6 while others will write their own sentences.
