You should compose your short essays in a word-processed document (e.g., MS Word) and then copy and paste them into CSU Mentor. Your response to each question should be a minimum of 1-2 paragraphs. Content, spelling, and grammar are important! The following are the questions students applying to EOP at CSUs are asked to answer:*

### Autobiographical Statements:

**Answers to the following questions will help us determine your motivation and preparation to undertake college work. Please answer as precisely and honestly as possible. Use complete sentences and avoid short responses such as "yes" or "no."**

- 1) Describe any volunteer, extracurricular activities, or work experience in which you are or have been involved in the past two years. List Educational Talent Search, Upward Bound Math & Science, AVID, Migrant Education, Friday Night Live, and any other educational programs you are involved in. List clubs, sports, community service, church groups, plus any leadership positions held.**
- 2) Why would you like to attend college? Discuss your career and personal goals. Are there any particular circumstances, school experiences, or persons that influenced your preparation or motivation to attend college (e.g., cultural/financial background, family, teachers, schools you attended)? Please explain. Share your personal goals in detail. How did you arrive at them? Who has made a difference in your life?**
