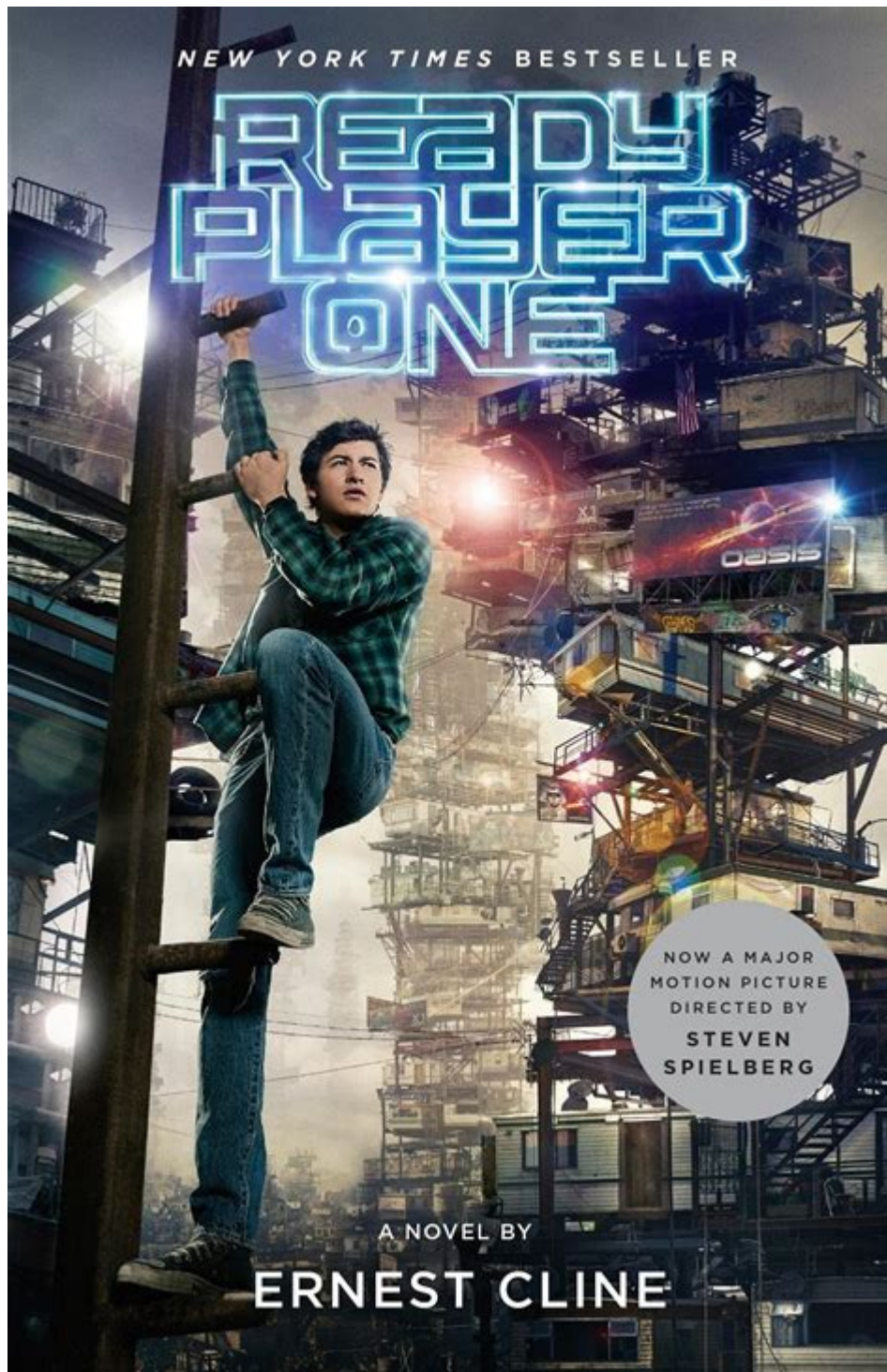


Ernest Cline Ready Player One
