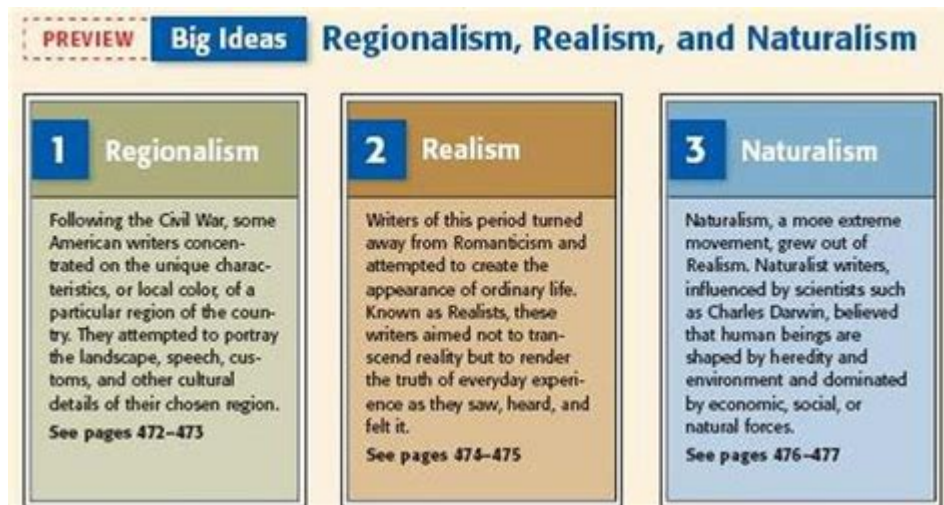


Examples Of Regionalism In Literature
