Introduction

Work Activities

Flight attendants look after airline passengers during flights and are trained to deal with emergency situations. Primarily, they are responsible for passenger safety.

Attendants arrive at the airport at least one hour before take-off to be allocated duties by the senior attendant. They are informed about passengers, such as unaccompanied children, who may need special attention.

Before passengers board, all the flight attendants (known as the air cabin crew) check emergency equipment, ensure that the aircraft is clean and tidy, and that all seat pockets contain the correct information. They then greet passengers on board, direct them to their seats, and help them store their hand luggage.

Before take-off, attendants check that all passengers are wearing seat belts. Some of the attendants demonstrate the use of oxygen equipment, explain emergency procedures, and point out emergency exits. (Some airlines have replaced this duty and show a video recording instead.)

During the flight, attendants may serve hot meals, snacks and drinks. They might sell duty-free goods such as alcohol, cigarettes and perfume. They continuously check that passengers are following regulations such as not smoking or using mobile

Once landed, and after all the passengers have safely left the plane, the attendants tidy the galley and check takings on duty-free goods and, food and drink.

Finally, they write a flight report, recording any unusual circumstances or problems. They may also have customs and immigration documents to fill in.

Long haul flights require periods away from home (possibly up to three weeks at a time). Domestic and short haul flights to Europe often involve a rapid turnaround.

Some airlines insist that staff live within a certain travelling time of the airport to reduce the chance of them arriving late. Working hours can be long and may be altered at short notice due to unforeseen circumstances, such as poor weather conditions.

Flight attendants have to wear a uniform and follow strict appearance regulations, such as pinning hair up if it is a certain length.
