The Legislative Branch

Background Information: The authors of the Constitution were inspired by the ideas from Baron de Montesquieu who was an Enlightenment thinker. Montesquieu believed that power consolidated in the hands of a few or less people was dangerous and would result in tyranny (loss of power). Montesquieu proposed the idea of dividing power into three branches. He believed dividing power would help prevent the abuse of power. The founding fathers adopted this idea when they drafted the Constitution. The Constitution consists of three branches: the legislative branch, which is Congress; the judicial branch, which is the Supreme Court; and the executive branch, which is the President.

The largest of the three branches is Congress, which consists of representatives who vote on laws. The founding fathers disagreed on how the number of representatives from each state should be determined. Two opposing plans were presented. The New Jersey Plan wanted representation based on equality. Each state would receive the same number of representatives regardless of its size or population. The Virginia Plan suggested that representation would be based on population, the larger a state's population, the greater the number of representatives it has. The conflict was resolved with the great compromise. The great compromise combined both plans by creating a bicameral congress. Bicameral means two houses. Congress was to be made up of a Senate which would be based on equality (2 senators per state) and a House of Representatives that would be based on population.



The House of Representatives

The House of Representatives is often referred to as "The People's House". It consists of 435 members. A representative must live in the state he or she represents and be at least 25 years old. The term for a member of the House is 2 years.

The Senate

There are 100 members of the Senate. Each state has 2 senators. A senator must live in the state he or she represents and be at least 30 years old.
