4. **ACADEMIC SUCCESS:** VOCABULARY IS A PREDICTOR OF ACADEMIC SUCCESS ACROSS SUBJECTS. A STRONG VOCABULARY CAN HELP STUDENTS EXCEL NOT JUST IN LANGUAGE ARTS, BUT IN SUBJECTS LIKE SCIENCE AND SOCIAL STUDIES WHERE SPECIALIZED TERMINOLOGY IS OFTEN USED.
5. **CONFIDENCE:** AS CHILDREN MASTER NEW WORDS, THEIR CONFIDENCE IN THEIR LANGUAGE ABILITIES GROWS, ENCOURAGING THEM TO PARTICIPATE MORE ACTIVELY IN CLASS DISCUSSIONS AND GROUP WORK.
