Basic Techniques

If you don't like a print, just set it aside and try another, or layer another color on top. Test color combinations and texture techniques. Treat this as a journey. There is an unexplored galaxy of possibilities out there waiting to be printed by your hand.



1 Squeeze a few drops of paint onto a Gelli plate.



2 Use a brayer to roll out paint smoothly.



3 Squeeze a few drops of a second color onto the plate.



4 Use the brayer to roll out a smooth layer (a marbling effect is what you're going for).



5 Lay a piece of paper over the plate and smooth the paper with your palm. Gently pull the paper up from one corner to check the color.



6 Finish pulling the paper all the way off. This is called "pulling the print."
