 - Prehypertension: 120-139, 80-89
 - Stage 1 Hypertension: 140-159, 90-99
 - o Stage 2 Hypertension: >160, >100
- · Blood pressure cuff...
 - o Too wide: false low
 - o Too narrow: false high
