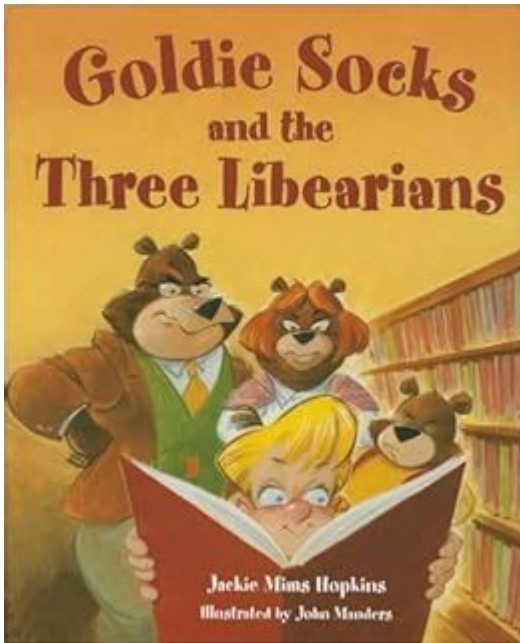


Goldilocks And The Three Libearians
