- Feminine adjectives are used with feminine nouns: **1J.mA es estudios**.
- Adjectives that end in -e and -ista may be used with either masculine or feminine nouns.

Marcos es muy deport.Im. Ana es muy deportista tambien.

- Adjectives with the masculine form -dor have -dora as the feminine form:
Juan es trabajador. Susana es trabajadora tambien.
