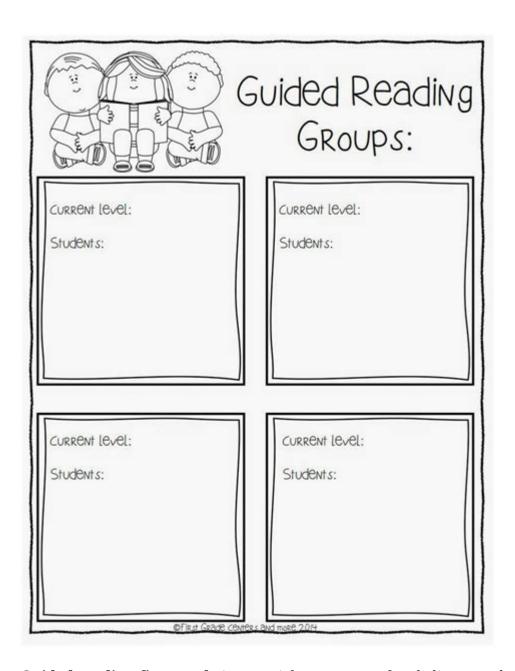
Guided Reading First Grade
