- 1. Compare and contrast the nation's government from Jefferson's era with Jackson's era. Who was eligible to participate in the democratic processes when each was elected (who could vote)? How did that impact who was represented in the federal government? (200-300 words) During Jefferson's time, only a select group of people had the right to vote. Typically, this group consisted of white men who owned property, often referred to as "freeholders." African Americans, women, Native Americans could not. Resulting in the image of specific interests and perspectives in government. The start of Jackson's presidency came during the era of Jacksonian democracy. They allowed more white men to vote even if they did not own property. Many states reduced or eliminated property ownership requirements, leading to an expansion of the white male voters. It's important to know that voting remained highly restricted for African Americans, women, and Native Americans. By allowing more citizens to vote during Jackson's era meant that voices and interestes were heard influencing the government's decisions. However, we need to remember that this change didn't include everyone, leaving some groups without a voice in government. It's very important to remember that these changes in voting rights were far from perfect, as many people were still excluded from the process. It's a reminder of how far our nation has come in expanding the right to vote and also how far we still have to go to ensure that every citizen's voice is heard. The changes in voting rights during the eras of Jefferson and Jackson show how they kept working to give our democracy more equal. It's a clear message that we must always strive to let more people vote, no matter who they are. These important events in history set the platform for later movements that pushed for more people to be represented in America.
- 2. Explain three ways the federal government changed or expanded from the time of Jefferson to Jackson. (200-300 words) The change of the U.S. federal government from the era of Thomas Jefferson to Andrew Jackson reflects an interesting development in the nation's history. These changes can be grouped into three key areas. The territorial expansion was crucial. The acquisition of the Louisiana Purchase under Jefferson was a monumental shift in the size and scope of the United States. It meant that the federal government had to adapt to manage and govern this vast new territory. Policies like the Northwest Ordinance of 1787 were important in arranging westward expansion and the addition of new states. The growth in federal power was intriguing, especially in the factors of both Jefferson and Jackson's limited government. The extent of federal authority increased during this period. Andrew Jackson's actions during the Nullification Crisis and his handling of the removal of Native American tribes indicated a stronger federal hand in settling matters. Additionally, the McCulloch v. The Maryland Supreme Court decision confirmed the existence of a national bank, which boosted the government's economic influence. Foundation development played an important role. The federal government initiated significant projects like roads, canals, and eventually the national railroad. These projects were directed at encouraging economic growth and improving the country's self-sufficiency. As the government funded and oversaw these ventures, it assumed a more leading role in shaping economic policy and the nation's foundation. The period spanning Jefferson to Jackson marked a significant expansion in the federal government's influence, activities, and reach. This transition was imperative to meet the evolving needs of an expanding United States, managing new territories, asserting federal authority, and actively participating

UNDERSTANDING DEMOCRACY

DEFINING DEMOCRACY

DEMOCRACY, AT ITS CORE, EMBODIES THE PRINCIPLE OF RULE BY THE PEOPLE. IT IS CHARACTERIZED BY:

- 1. POPULAR SOVEREIGNTY: THE IDEA THAT THE AUTHORITY OF THE GOVERNMENT IS DERIVED FROM THE CONSENT OF THE GOVERNED.
- 2. POLITICAL EQUALITY: EVERY CITIZEN HAS AN EQUAL SAY IN THE DECISIONS THAT AFFECT THEIR LIVES.
- 3. MAJORITY RULE AND MINORITY RIGHTS: WHILE THE MAJORITY'S WISHES ARE RESPECTED, THE RIGHTS OF MINORITY GROUPS ARE PROTECTED.
- 4. RULE OF LAW: ALL INDIVIDUALS, INCLUDING GOVERNMENT OFFICIALS, ARE SUBJECT TO THE LAW.

Types of Democracy

DEMOCRACY CAN BE CATEGORIZED INTO SEVERAL TYPES:

- DIRECT DEMOCRACY: CITIZENS DIRECTLY PARTICIPATE IN DECISION-MAKING PROCESSES. THIS FORM WAS PREVALENT IN ANCIENT ATHENS.
- REPRESENTATIVE DEMOCRACY: CITIZENS ELECT REPRESENTATIVES TO MAKE DECISIONS ON THEIR BEHALF, A SYSTEM COMMONLY FOUND IN MODERN DEMOCRATIC NATIONS.
- PARTICIPATORY DEMOCRACY: EMPHASIZES BROAD PARTICIPATION OF CONSTITUENTS IN THE DIRECTION AND OPERATION OF POLITICAL SYSTEMS.
- DELIBERATIVE DEMOCRACY: FOCUSES ON THE IMPORTANCE OF DISCUSSION AND DELIBERATION IN DECISION-MAKING.

THE HISTORICAL CONTEXT OF DEMOCRACY

ANCIENT ROOTS OF DEMOCRACY

THE CONCEPT OF DEMOCRACY CAN BE TRACED BACK TO ANCIENT CIVILIZATIONS, PARTICULARLY IN GREECE AROUND THE 5TH CENTURY BCE. KEY FEATURES INCLUDE:

- ATHENIAN DEMOCRACY: IN ATHENS, CITIZENS (FREE MEN) PARTICIPATED DIRECTLY IN LEGISLATIVE DECISIONS AND HAD THE OPPORTUNITY TO SPEAK AND VOTE ON PUBLIC MATTERS.
- ROMAN REPUBLIC: THE ROMAN SYSTEM INTRODUCED REPRESENTATIVE ELEMENTS, ALLOWING ELECTED OFFICIALS TO REPRESENT THE INTERESTS OF CITIZENS.

THE MEDIEVAL PERIOD TO THE ENLIGHTENMENT

DURING THE MEDIEVAL PERIOD, DEMOCRATIC PRACTICES DWINDLED IN EUROPE, BUT IDEAS BEGAN TO EVOLVE:

- Magna Carta (1215): This landmark document limited the powers of the king and laid the groundwork for parliamentary democracy.
- RENAISSANCE AND ENLIGHTENMENT THINKERS: PHILOSOPHERS LIKE JOHN LOCKE AND MONTESQUIEU ADVOCATED FOR CONCEPTS SUCH AS NATURAL RIGHTS, SEPARATION OF POWERS, AND SOCIAL CONTRACTS, WHICH WOULD INFLUENCE FUTURE DEMOCRATIC MOVEMENTS.

THE EVOLUTION OF DEMOCRACY IN THE MODERN ERA

THE AMERICAN REVOLUTION AND ITS IMPACT

THE AMERICAN REVOLUTION (1775-1783) WAS A CRITICAL TURNING POINT IN THE EVOLUTION OF DEMOCRACY. KEY

OUTCOMES INCLUDE:

- DECLARATION OF INDEPENDENCE (1776): ASSERTED THE COLONIES' RIGHT TO SELF-GOVERNANCE AND THE PRINCIPLE THAT GOVERNMENTS DERIVE THEIR POWER FROM THE CONSENT OF THE GOVERNED.
- U.S. CONSTITUTION (1787): ESTABLISHED A REPRESENTATIVE DEMOCRACY WITH CHECKS AND BALANCES, INFLUENCING NUMEROUS OTHER DEMOCRATIC MOVEMENTS WORLDWIDE.

THE FRENCH REVOLUTION AND DEMOCRATIC IDEALS

THE FRENCH REVOLUTION (1789-1799) FURTHER PROPAGATED DEMOCRATIC IDEALS:

- LIBERT? , ? GALIT? , FRATERNIT? : THE RALLYING CRY FOR LIBERTY, EQUALITY, AND BROTHERHOOD INSPIRED COUNTLESS MOVEMENTS FOR DEMOCRACY.
- Universal Suffrage: Although initially limited, the revolution eventually led to broader voting rights, setting a precedent for future democratic expansions.

19th CENTURY DEVELOPMENTS

THE 19TH CENTURY SAW SIGNIFICANT ADVANCEMENTS IN DEMOCRATIC PRACTICES:

- EXPANSION OF SUFFRAGE: MANY NATIONS, INCLUDING THE UK, BEGAN TO EXTEND VOTING RIGHTS BEYOND LANDOWNERS.
- RISE OF POLITICAL PARTIES: POLITICAL PARTIES EMERGED, REPRESENTING DIVERSE INTERESTS AND FACILITATING ORGANIZED PARTICIPATION IN GOVERNANCE.

20TH CENTURY CRISES

THE 20TH CENTURY PRESENTED NUMEROUS CHALLENGES TO DEMOCRATIC SYSTEMS:

- WORLD WARS: THE DEVASTATION OF WORLD WAR I AND WORLD WAR II LED TO QUESTIONS ABOUT THE VIABILITY OF DEMOCRACY, WITH SOME NATIONS SUCCUMBING TO AUTHORITARIAN REGIMES.
- COLD WAR: THE IDEOLOGICAL BATTLE BETWEEN DEMOCRACY AND COMMUNISM PROMPTED VARIOUS MOVEMENTS FOR DEMOCRATIC GOVERNANCE IN EASTERN EUROPE AND BEYOND.

THE LATE 20TH CENTURY AND THE RISE OF DEMOCRATIC MOVEMENTS

THE LATE 20TH CENTURY WITNESSED A RESURGENCE OF DEMOCRATIC MOVEMENTS:

- FALL OF THE BERLIN WALL (1989): SYMBOLIZED THE COLLAPSE OF COMMUNIST REGIMES IN EASTERN EUROPE, LEADING TO A WAVE OF DEMOCRATIZATION.
- ARAB SPRING (2010-2012): A SERIES OF PROTESTS ACROSS THE ARAB WORLD CALLED FOR DEMOCRATIC REFORMS, ALTHOUGH THE OUTCOMES VARIED SIGNIFICANTLY AMONG COUNTRIES.
