EARLY 19TH CENTURY

JUNE 15, 1844

American chemist and engineer Charles Goodyear patented vulcanized rubber.



Charles Goodyear invented the first soccer ball Made from rubber, it would go on to revolutionize the world of soccer.

1862

H.J. Lindon developed a rubber bladder that people could inflate. This ensured soccer balls maintained their spherical shape

1872

The English Football [soccer] Association set the specifications for soccer balls used in professional competitions.

1931

Argentinians Romano Polo, Antonio Tossolini, and Juan Valbonesi received a patent for developing a soccer ball without a leather lace

1963

Adidas, the manufacturer of the FIFA World Cup soccer ball, first began producing soccer balls.

1970

Adidas released the Telstar ball for the 1970 World Cup. It's iconic design included 32 black and white panels.



1978 AND 1982

The Tango soccer ball was created. It had a unique design that caused it to create an optical illusion, making it appear as though there were 12 identical circles on the ball's surface.

1986 - 1994

Over the next World Cup tournaments the Azteca, Etrusco, and Questra balls were used. These were the first balls using a polyurethane coating and polyurethane coating foam inside.

1998 - 2006

The Tricolore, Fevernova, and Teamgeist soccer balls were used.

These were the first World Cup balls to depart from a black and white color scheme.

2010

The Jabulani soccer ball was used at the World Cup. This ball was heavily criticized for being unpredictable in flight.
