How to Build a Cigar Box Guitar

This guide will walk you through building a basic "stick on box" 3-string cigar box guitar meant for playing with a slide. We worked hard to keep these plans nice and easy to follow, so that you can get your first cigar box guitar built with a minimum of effort and frustration.

We call it our "Pure & Simple Cigar Box Guitar Kit" and it was designed to be the EASIEST kit to build available anywhere. We'll start with listing the parts and tools you'll need (with some ideas on where you can find them), and then get into the how-to.

PARTS YOU'LL NEED

- 1. A Cigar Box
- 2. A 3-foot long 1x2" piece of hardwood lumber
- 3. Three (3) Guitar Tuners (Machine Heads)
- 4. A bolt, threaded rod or piece of wooden dowel for the nut
- 5. Another bolt, threaded rod or piece of wooden dowel for the bridge
- 6. Three (3) Guitar Strings
