
How To Make An Origami Dragon

STEP-BY-STEP INSTRUCTIONS ON HOW TO MAKE AN ORIGAMI DRAGON

STEP 3: FOLD THE PAPER IN HALF DIAGONALLY AGAIN

- Now take the other two corners (the left and right) and fold them together, creating another crease. Unfold again. You should now see an "X" shape on your paper.

STEP 4: CREATE THE BASE FOLDS

- FOLD THE TOP CORNER DOWN TO MEET THE BOTTOM CREASE, THEN FOLD THE BOTTOM CORNER UP TO MEET THE TOP CREASE. THIS WILL CREATE A KITE SHAPE.

STEP 5: FORM THE DRAGON'S HEAD

- Take the top point of the kite shape and fold it downwards, about one-third of the way down. This will be the dragon's head.

STEP 6: CREATE THE NECK

- FOLD THE SIDES OF THE TRIANGLE YOU JUST CREATED TOWARDS THE CENTER CREASE. THIS WILL GIVE THE DRAGON A MORE DEFINED NECK.

STEP 7: SHAPE THE WINGS

- FLIP THE PAPER OVER. TAKE THE TWO OUTER EDGES (THE LONGEST POINTS OF THE TRIANGLE) AND FOLD THEM BACK TOWARDS THE CENTER TO CREATE THE WINGS. MAKE SURE THE WINGS ARE SYMMETRICAL.

STEP 8: FORM THE TAIL

- TO CREATE THE TAIL, FOLD THE BOTTOM POINT OF THE KITE SHAPE UPWARDS, THEN FOLD IT BACK DOWN TO CREATE A ZIGZAG EFFECT, GIVING YOUR DRAGON A DYNAMIC TAIL.

STEP 9: FINAL ADJUSTMENTS

- ADJUST THE WINGS AND TAIL AS NEEDED. YOU CAN ALSO FOLD THE TIPS OF THE WINGS SLIGHTLY UPWARDS TO GIVE THEM A MORE REALISTIC APPEARANCE.

STEP 10: ADDING DETAILS

- Use your scissors to cut small notches in the wings or tail to create scales. You can also draw eyes or other features using fine markers.

TIPS FOR SUCCESSFUL ORIGAMI DRAGON MAKING
