BETA ADRENERGIC BLOCKERS - Answer -block sympathetic vasomotor response -side effects: orthostatic hypotension, bradycardia, N/V, diarrhea, CHF, blood dyscrasias

-monitor BP, HR, cardiac rhythm, edema
