Fees vary by age:

- 16 to 16½ \$75.00 16½ to 17 \$72.50
- 17 to 17½ \$85.00 17½ to 18 \$72.50
- 18 to 18½ \$65.00 18½ to 21 \$65.00
- 21 and older \$62.50 - \$55.00

→ WHAT TO BRING

You must bring the Application For Driver License or ID Card (MV-44) and your U.S. Social Security card as well as the following:

Proof Of Identity And Age

You need six (6) total points of proof. One or more of your proofs must have your signature. Each document must be an original or certified document. You cannot use more than one document of a specific type for points.

- US Passport 8 points
- Certificate of Citizenship 3 points
- Certificate of Naturalization 3 points
- Foreign passport w/ valid I-551 stamp 3 points
- Permanent resident card 3 points
- Foreign passport w/ Visa & Form I-94 3 points
- Employment authorization card 3 points
- US Military photo ID card 3 points
- Health insurance card 1 point
- Utility bill issued in the US 1 point
- Bank statement 1 point
- Valid major credit card 1 point
- A NYS driver license, learner permit, non-driver photo ID is worth 6 points

Proof of Date of Birth

Document must be the original, or a certified photocopy from the issuing agency. DMV will accept ANY ONE of these documents:

- Birth certificate issued and certified by a Board of Health or Bureau of Vital Statistics in the U.S., its territories, or possessions. Foreign birth certificates are not acceptable. NYS Photo License/Permit/ Non-Driver ID Card, Military Photo ID Card, U.S. Passport, Foreign Passport (with USCIS documentation), Immigration Documents

1. Which of the following must you obey over the other three: steady red light, flashing red light, STOP sign, or police officer?
You must obey the instructions of a police officer even though they may be contrary to laws, signs, signals and markings. (Pg. 63)

Never under any circumstances. (pg 49)
10. True or False: Flashing red lights, lowered crossing gates and/or a ringing bell at a railroad crossing mean you should speed up to beat the train.
False. You must stop at least 15-feet from the tracks. (pg 46)
11. If two vehicles reach an intersection about at the same time, one turning left and the other going straight-ahead, which one has the right of way?
The driver turning left must yield to approaching traffic going straight or turning right. (pg 50)
