Characteristics of ANTIHYPERTENSIVES - Answer -decreases BP

-increases blood flow

-decrease HR

-decrease cardiac output

-end in PRIL or LOL

ACE Inhibitors

(Angiotensin Converting Enzyme Inhibitors) - Answer -end in PRIL

-side effects include: hypotension, N/V, hacking cough, respiratory symptoms

-monitor VS, WBC and electrolytes

BETA ADRENERGIC BLOCKERS - Answer -block sympathetic vasomotor response

-side effects: orthostatic hypotension, bradycardia, N/V, diarrhea, CHF, blood dyscrasias

-monitor BP, HR, cardiac rhythm, edema
