DAVID DIOP:

David Léon Mandessi Diop was born in 1927 in Bordeaux, France, to a Senegalese father and a Cameroonian mother. One of the most talented of the younger French West African poets of the 1950s, whose tragic death in an airplane crash cut short a promising career.

Diop's works in *Coups de pilon* (1956; "Pounding"), his only surviving collection, are angry poems of protest against European cultural values, enumerating the sufferings of his people first under the slave trade and then under the domination of colonial rule and calling for revolution to lead to a glorious future for Africa. That he was the most extreme of the Negritude writers (who were reacting against the assumption underlying the French policy of "assimilation" that Africa was a deprived land possessing neither culture nor history) can be seen in his rejection of the idea that any good could have come to Africa through the colonial experience and in his belief that political freedom must precede a cultural and economic revival. He wrote during the period when the struggle for independence in many African countries was at its height. Though he himself grew up and lived most of his life in France, his strong opposition to European society was reinforced by time spent living in Africa, teaching school first in Senegal and later in Guinea.

During his literary career, he was a proponent of Negritude. This was a political philosophy/literary movement whose scholars included statesman-poet Leopold Sedar Senghor. Negritude was a reaction to the French colonial administrative policy of assimilation; this policy was predicated on the belief that Africans possessed neither culture nor history and therefore French culture could be used to civilise them. Negritude desired a deep and almost essentialist re-grounding of Africans in the history, values, cultures of the Black people, while being open to friendship with other civilisations. While some writers in this movement were bitter and pessimistic, Diop took a different path. Many of his poems expressed hopefulness and comfort for those in exile from Africa. He wrote about this in both a literal and figurative manner. For example, in "Africa," he personifies the continent as an angry elder. The elder is aware of the impending revolution, and chides the narrator for thinking rash thoughts. The poem below by Diop reflects those values. David Diop died in an airplane crash in 1960. He was 33.
