Revised Statute 47:287:554 requires every corporation that can reasonably When a corporation does business within and without Louis expect its estimated income tax for the year to be \$1,000 or more to make nstallment payments of its liability. The term "estimated tax" means the amount the taxpayer estimates to be the Louisiana income tax imposed

allowable against the tax. Payments of estimated income tax can only be applied against corporation income tax.

### ALLOCATION AND APPORTIONMENT OF NET INCOME AND

PRANCHISE TAXABLE BASE

Louisiana income tax is imposed only upon that part of the net income of a corporation that is derived from sources within Louisiana.

Louisiana franchise tax is imposed only on that part of the total taxable capital that is employed in Louisiana.

### REPORT OF FEDERAL ADJUSTMENTS

Revised Statute 47:287.614(C) requires every taxpayer whose federal return is adjusted to amend the Louisiana return reporting such adjustments within 180 days of the final determination of the adjustments by the IRS. The 'Amended Due to IRS Audit' box should be marked to indicate that an amended return is being filed as a result of an IRS audit and a statement should accompany the amended return disclosing the nature and amounts of such adjustments.
