- ABILITY TO ACCURATELY CONVEY MESSAGES WITHOUT ALTERING THE MEANING.

CULTURAL AWARENESS

- Understanding cultural differences that may affect communication.
- ABILITY TO NAVIGATE CULTURAL NUANCES TO ENSURE RESPECTFUL AND EFFECTIVE INTERPRETATION.

INTERPERSONAL SKILLS

- STRONG LISTENING SKILLS TO CAPTURE AND INTERPRET INFORMATION ACCURATELY.
- EMPATHY TO UNDERSTAND PATIENTS' FEELINGS AND CONCERNS.

TECHNICAL SKILLS

- FAMILIARITY WITH MEDICAL SOFTWARE AND ELECTRONIC HEALTH RECORDS (EHR).
- ABILITY TO USE REMOTE INTERPRETING TECHNOLOGIES, INCLUDING VIDEO AND PHONE SERVICES.

ETHICAL CONSIDERATIONS IN MEDICAL INTERPRETATION

ETHICS PLAY A CRUCIAL ROLE IN MEDICAL INTERPRETATION. INTERPRETERS MUST ADHERE TO SPECIFIC GUIDELINES TO MAINTAIN PROFESSIONALISM AND ENSURE PATIENT SAFETY. KEY ETHICAL PRINCIPLES INCLUDE:
