Parent/Guardian Request to deny driver license - ANSWER-The parent or guardian of a person who is under the age of 18 may request the Director of Revenue to deny that person a driver license. The denial expires at age 18.

Under - 21 Driver License - ANSWER-If you are under 21 years of age, the Department of Revenue will issue you a license identifying you as a minor. When 21, you may apply and pay for another driver license or wait until your license expires
