MLA CITATION WORKSHEET

When you cite your sources, you must provide as much information as possible. I realize that when using the internet, it can be difficult to find some of the information being requested.

- Many times with internet sources, especially on an online database, there is no AUTHOR NAME. When this occurs, you simply start with the next piece of available information, which should be the TITLE OF THE ARTICLE.
- Another piece of information that is difficult to find is the DATE LAST UPDATED – this is usually found at the bottom of the webpage and will either be in the form of a copyright date or will say "last updated on: ".
- The DATE LAST UPDATED and the DATE OF ACCESS should be formatted in the following way NUMBER DAY ABBREVIATED MONTH YEAR (Example: 19 Apr. 2010).
- Make sure that when you type your bibliography, the information appears just as it is shown in the example provided below. The first line of the bibliography citation should be left-aligned and the second line should be indented once (push the TAB key).
- For the URL, include the entire web address by copying and pasting the link, or in this case, handwriting it. Use the carrot marks < (shift + comma key) and > (shift + period key) at the ends of the URL and end with a period.
