8.1.1 Democracy Expands: *How did changes in suffrage affect political parties and elections?*

1. Growing ideas of DEMOCRACY changed the POLITICAL SYSTEM and American ideas of SOCIAL CLASSES and was influenced by the rise of ANDREW JACKSON. The time he dominated American politics from 1824 to 1845 was known as the AGE OF JACKSON.
2. ALEXIS DE TOCQUEVILLE of France came to the US in 1831 to study American PRISONS. In his tour of the US he observed more than prisons including the SOCIETY that was becoming more democratic. He wrote DEMOCRACY IN AMERICA where he admired American goals of EQUALITY and FREEDOM while pointing out where America still has ways to go to meet these goals.
3. More Americans gained SUFFRAGE in the 1820s while other were denied FULL participation. The US was growing rapidly with new STATES adding to SECTIONAL divisions over taxes, TRADE, and other issues but did agree on expanding voting rights to almost all WHITE MEN over the age of 21. By the 1830s, most eastern states had dropped the requirement to own LAND. More men exercised this right as voter TURNOUT rose from 58% in 1828 to nearly 80% in 1840.
4. **ANALYZE IMAGES:** Based on this chart, who ranked in the highest class in American society?
5. WOMEN, NATIVE Americans, and most AFRICAN Americans could not vote while a few states kept the PROPERTY owner requirement. As white men WON suffrage, African Americans began to LOSE it as first SOUTHERN and then NEW ENGLAND states began to take away the right to vote from FREE African Americans, or kept property requirements while dropping it for whites.

8.1.2 The Election of 1824 Leads to a "Tie": *How did national support of the 1824 election both cause and solve a tie?*

1. FOUR candidates in 1824 were all [Democratic] Republicans but had support in different regions:

New England	West	West	South
John Quincy Adams	Henry Clay	Andrés Bello	John C. Calhoun

2. JOHN QUINCY ADAMS, son of the 2nd president, served as SECRETARY OF STATE and helped to end the WAR OF 1812 and helped to set American FOREIGN POLICY for many years but common people thought him HARD and COLD.
