
Ny State Standards Social Studies



GRADES 7 and 8 United States and New York State History

Overview:

Social studies content in grades 7 and 8 focuses on a chronologically organized study of United States and New York State history. By including hemispheric links to Canada and Mexico when appropriate, teachers will provide students a model for the global connections they will discover in the grades 9 and 10 social studies program.
