#### Section 1: Reading Test

#### QUESTION 1

Choice A is the best answer. The first paragraph explains the narrator's love of reading: "Even then my only friends were made of paper and ink.... Where my school friends saw notches of ink on incomprehensible pages, I saw light, streets, and people." The fourth paragraph reiterates this love in its description of the bookshop as a "sanctuary" and "refuge." Choice B is incorrect because the passage never focuses on the narrator's father, who primarily serves to illustrate the narrator's determination to read books despite all obstacles. Choice C is incorrect because the passage focuses on the narrator's desire to write rather than on whatever skill he may have as a write. Choice D is incorrect because the passage doesn't make the narrator's childhood hardships its central focus or analyze the effects of those hardships.

#### QUESTION 2

Choice C is the best answer. In the first paragraph, the third sentence describes the narrator's love of reading ("where my school friends saw notches of ink on incomprehensible pages, I saw light, streets, and people"), and the fourth sentence describes the role that reading played in the narrator's life ("a safe haven from that home, those streets, and those troubled days in which even I could sense that only a limited fortune awaited me"). The remainder of the passage recounts incidents in which the narrator's actions arise from his love of, and dependence on, reading. Thus the third and fourth sentences can be seen as describing a passion that accounts for those actions.
