Reading Test Strategies	
Reading Comprehension Passages:	
<ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Save the HARDEST passage for last.2. Each passage should average about 45 minutes3. Read introductory info to predict type of text<ul style="list-style-type: none">• narrative; persuasive; regulatory4. Read and annotate for:<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Author's purpose (topic sentences—"What's his/her point?" Attitude?)• Transition words5. Answer Questions, using POE (Process of Elimination)<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Detect incorrect answer choices by searching for:<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Answers that contain extra information or are slightly off• Answers that represent the opposite of the relationship described in the passage• Answers that are irrelevant or are just a mish-mash of concepts found in the passage• Answers that are plausible interpretations of the passage, but are not supported by any direct evidence• Answers that contain fiction that is too charged	
Evidence Questions:	
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Use the passage and the graphics together• Save these two paired questions for last in each passage as they take the longest. Answer the comprehension first, marking the text where you found your answer. Then, move on to the evidence question. It should align with where you found your text support. Use process of elimination to rule out evidence you know does not fit.• Other questions may help you answer evidence-based questions – if you're stumped, move on & look for hints	
Paired Passage Strategies:	
<ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Read (and annotate) & answer all questions for Passage 12. Read (and annotate) & answer all questions for Passage 23. Answer all relationship (synthesis) questions4. Use Process of Elimination: if part of an answer is wrong, you can eliminate it entirely.	
Vocab in Context:	
<ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Define the word IN CONTEXT yourself BEFORE you look at the answer choices.2. Check answer choices for a match with the word you picked.3. ALWAYS plug your choice back in. (If it doesn't make sense, back up and start over!)
