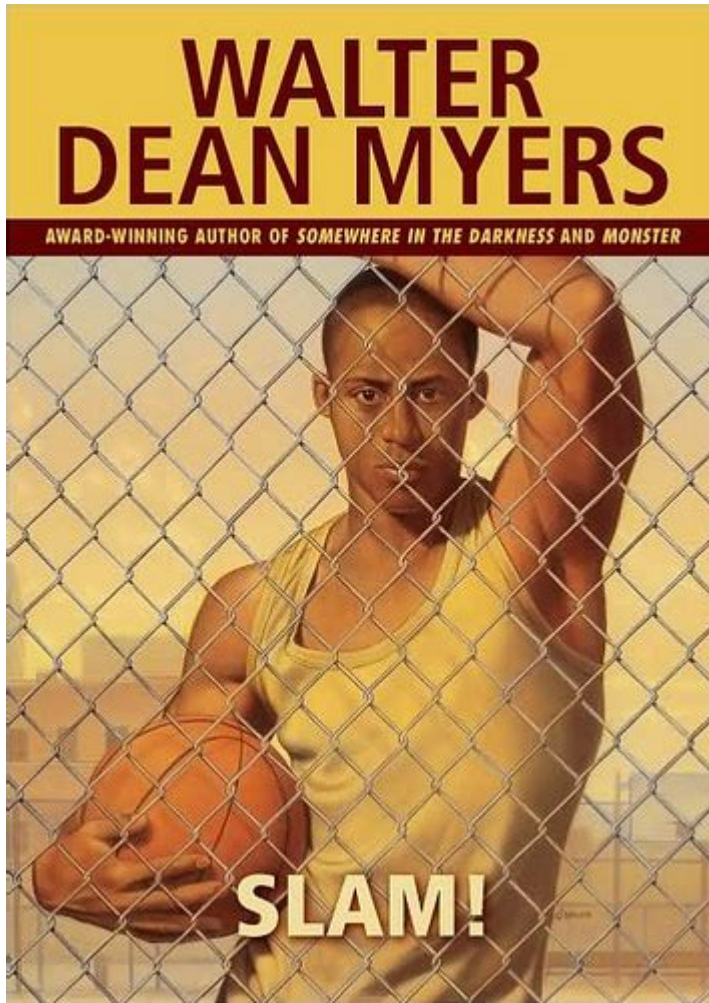


Slam Walter Dean Myers
