It does not have a variable.• Experiment - Procedure carried out under controlled conditions to test a hypothesis. Has a variable and a hypothesis.• Variable - The one thing you are changing or testing in an experiment. (Ex: fertilizer in plants)• Control group - Do nothing to this group and compare all other setups to it.• Models - Used to understand things that are too big (the universe) or too small (cells) or to describe the way things work. <p>Example: Experiment: Does plant food help to produce more tomatoes? Variable: Plant Food Control Group: The plants without plant food. (This group does not have the variable. If you gave all plants the food, how would you know if the plant food was helping at all? You wouldn't, you need a control. This way, you can compare the number of tomatoes the control makes and compare it to the number of tomatoes the plant with the food makes.) Data: You would count the number of tomatoes produced in all of the plants, the ones with the variable and the one without.</p>

Explanations must always have evidence.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Testable - experiments should be based on observations and facts that are measurable• Opinion - someone's personal preference or interpretation. It is not based on evidence or facts. If I say earthworms are afraid of light that is an interpretation. A factual observation would be earthworms move away from light.
