- ✓ If you are married filing separately and you lived apart from your spouse for all of 2014, enter "D" to the right of the word "benefits" on line 20a. If you do not, you may get a math error notice from the IRS.
- ✓ Be sure you have read the **Exception** in the line 20a and 20b instructions to see if you can use this worksheet instead of a publication to find out if any of your benefits are taxable.

Combine lines 2, 3, and 4 5. </p> <p>6. Enter the total of the amounts from Form 1040, lines 23 through 32, plus any write-in adjustments you entered on the dotted line next to line 36 6. </p> <p>7. Is the amount on line 6 less than the amount on line 5?</p> <p><input type="checkbox"/> No. STOP None of your social security benefits are taxable. Enter -0- on Form 1040, line 20b.</p> <p><input type="checkbox"/> Yes. Subtract line 6 from line 5 7. </p> <p>8. If you are:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Married filing jointly, enter \$32,000• Single, head of household, qualifying widow(er), or married filing separately and you lived apart from your spouse for all of 2014, enter \$25,000• Married filing separately and you lived with your spouse at any time in 2014, skip lines 8 through 15; multiply line 7 by 85% (.85) and enter the result on line 16. Enter: \$12,000 if married filing jointly; \$9,000 if single, head of household, qualifying widow(er), or married filing separately and you lived apart from your spouse for all of 2014 10. </p> <p>11. Subtract line 10 from line 9. If zero or less, enter -0- 11. </p> <p>12. Enter the smaller of line 9 or line 10 12. </p> <p>13. Enter one-half of line 12 13. </p> <p>14. Enter the smaller of line 2 or line 13 14. </p> <p>15. Multiply line 11 by 85% (.85). If line 11 is zero, enter -0- 15. </p> <p>16. Add lines 14 and 15 16. </p> <p>17. Multiply line 1 by 85% (.85) 17. </p> <p>18. Taxable social security benefits. Enter the smaller of line 16 or line 17.
