
Read for **comprehension** below.

Pavel Friedmann was a Jewish Czechoslovak poet during World War II. He wrote "The Butterfly" shortly after he was deported to the Terezin Ghetto in 1942. He was 21 years old. Eighteen months later, Pavel was sent to Auschwitz and executed.

In 1996, Holocaust Museum Houston (HMH) launched The Butterfly Project. The project was centered around Friedmann's poem and asked children to submit handmade butterflies. Each butterfly represented a child that had died during the Holocaust. But children weren't the only ones to participate. The project struck a chord in people around the world and butterflies began to flow in. The Butterfly Project lasted for 20 years and received 1.5 million butterflies.
