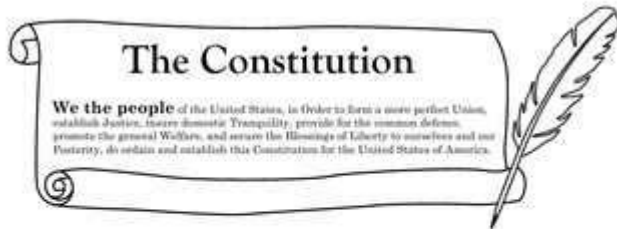


# The Birth Of The Constitution Compromise Worksheet Answers
