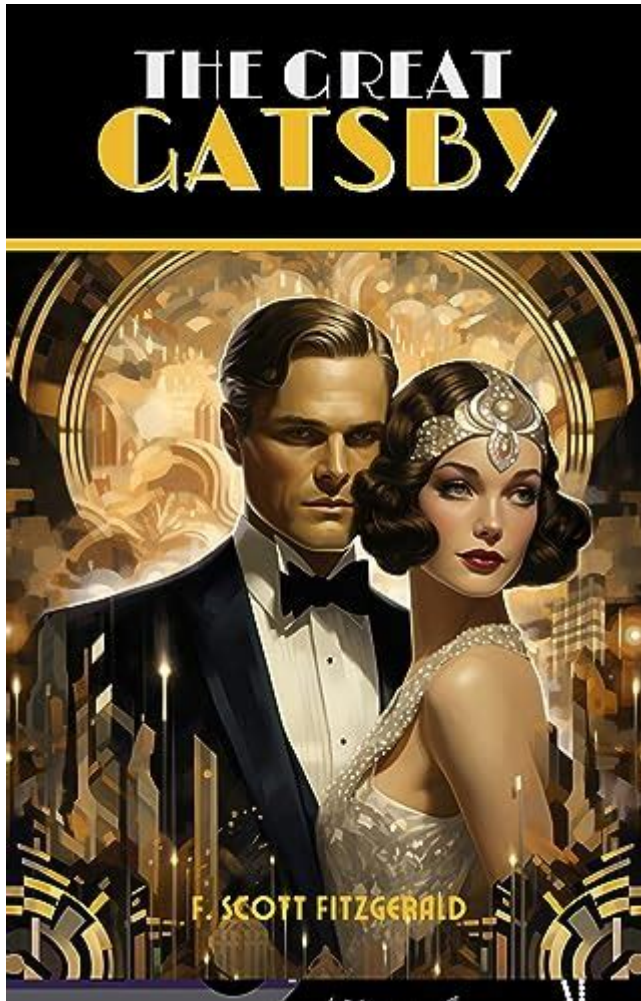


The Great Gatsby F Scott Fitzgerald
