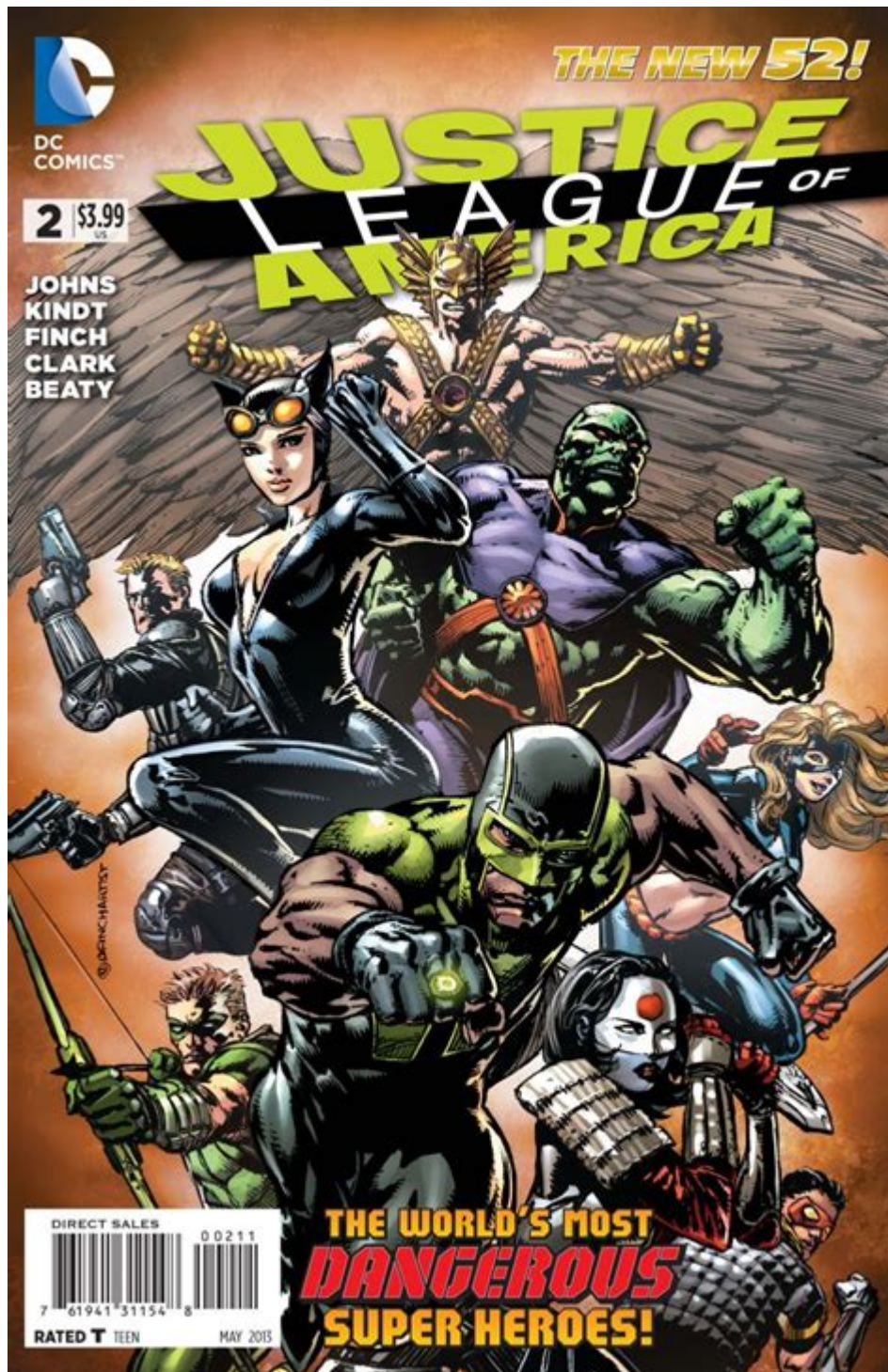


The New 52 Justice League Of America
