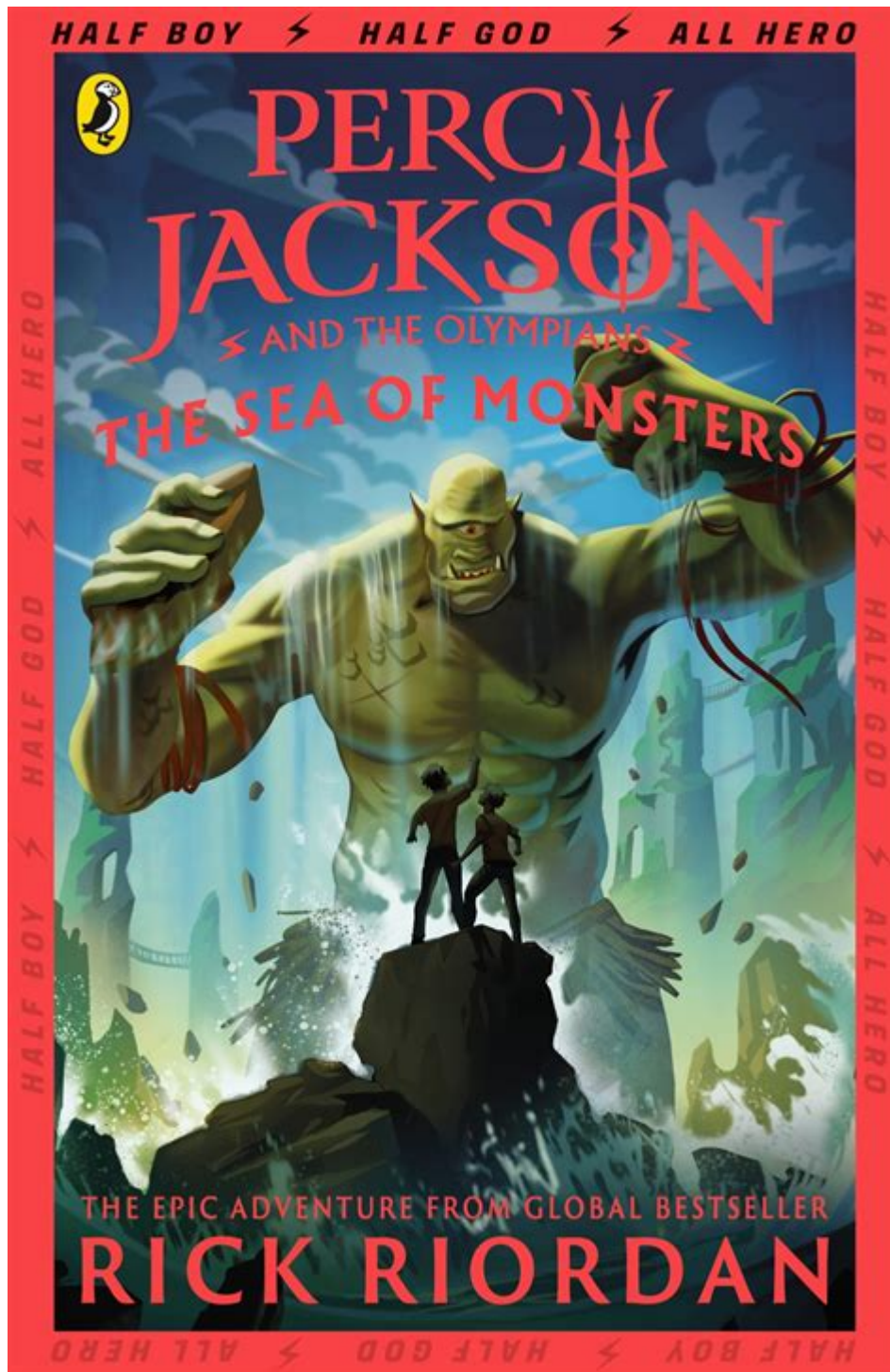


The Sea Of Monsters By Rick Riordan
