| <p><b>JOB DESCRIPTION:</b> Under direct supervision, Maintainer's Helper - Group B assist in the maintenance, inspection, repair, alteration and repair of bus and other automotive electro-mechanical equipment. They clean and lubricate bus parts, remove bus parts and equipment using hand tools, files, hammers, hand tools and equipment, remove and replace worn bearing, rods, pistons, pins, valves and change the time, check and maintain fuel levels of engine oil, lubricate, replace and adjust engine machine reservoirs, fuel lines, clean water air, sandblast parts, drive buses and trucks, and perform maintenance.</p> <p>Some of the physical activities performed by Maintainer's Helper - Group B and environmental conditions experienced are: working outdoors in all weather conditions; working on slippery surfaces while working parts; reaching places to drive or assist, climbing and descending ladders, working inside, above or in a hole; work while using sandblasting equipment, using both hands in work; standing for extended periods of time; responding to audible signals such as horns, bells, and whistles; responding to visual signals including flashing red lights; and lifting heavy equipment and moving it manually.</p> <p><b>Special Working Conditions:</b> Maintainer's Helper - Group B may be required to work various shifts including nights, Saturdays, Sundays and holidays.</p> <p>(This is a brief description of what you might do in this position and does not include all the duties of this position.)</p> <p><b>SALARY AND BENEFITS:</b> The current minimum salary is \$15.67 per hour for a 40-hour week increasing to \$20.00 in the fourth year. An Associate's degree or completion of 60 college level semester credits in mechanical, electrical or machine shop technology from an accredited college or university, accredited by regional, national bodies by the U.S. Secretary of Education and by the Council for Higher Educational Accreditation (CHEA); or</li><li>3. Graduation from a recognized trade school, technical school or vocational high school, approved by a state's Department of Education or comparable agency, with a major course of study in mechanical, electrical or machine shop technology, totaling 900 hours; or</li><li>4. A four-year high school diploma or its educational equivalent approved by a state's Department of Education or a recognized accrediting organization, plus three years of full-time experience as described in "1" above; or</li><li>5.
