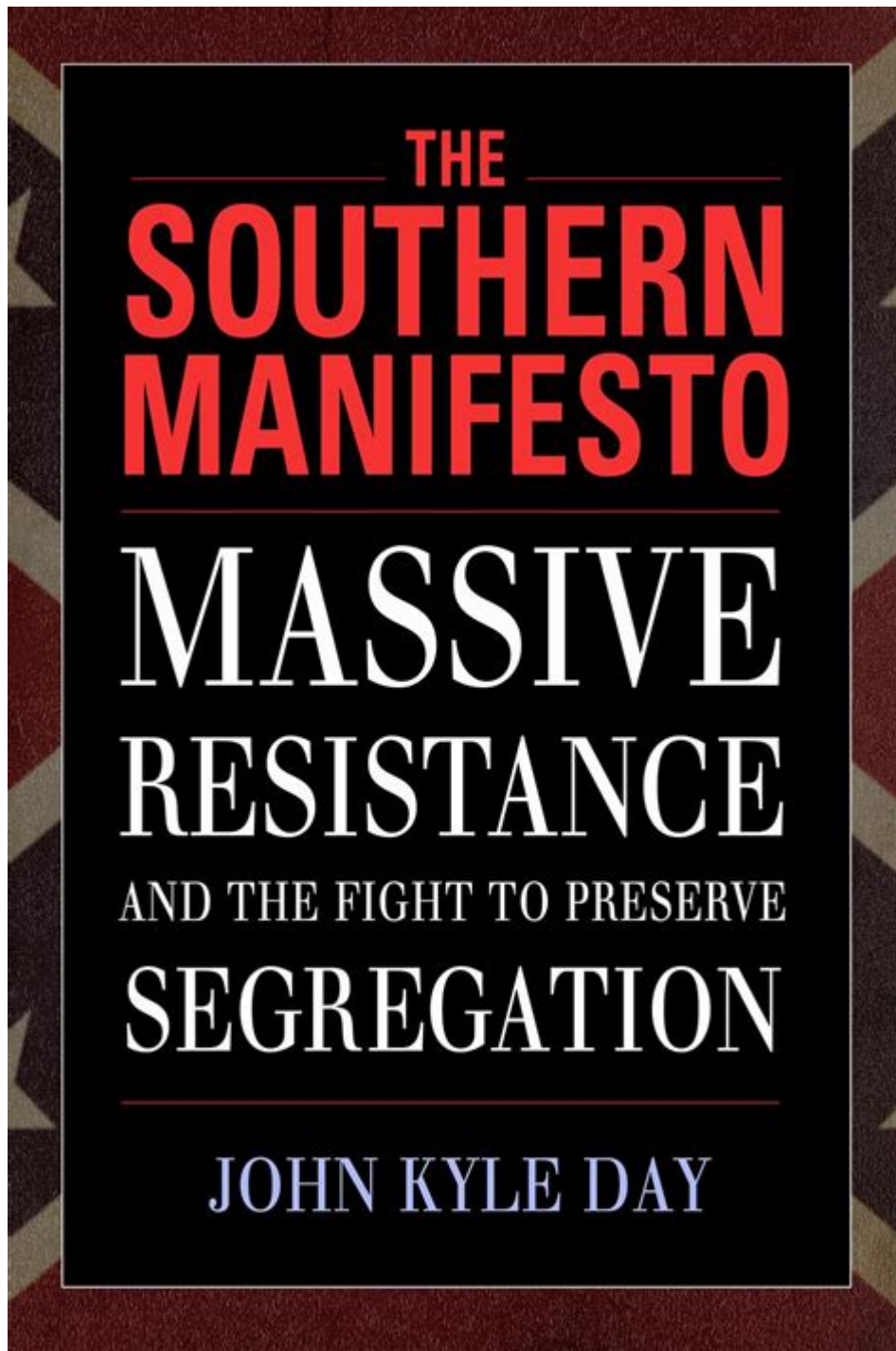


What Was The Southern Manifesto
